MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE BOARD

It is with great satisfaction that we present this report on the activities of Instituto Mattos Filho (IMF) in 2020. Our work in favor of law and access to justice has reverberated throughout Brazil, boosting IMF's reputation within civil society. Internally, we have seen the involvement of more partners and associates in our programs.

In many respects, 2020 was a year of consolidation for IMF. Scholarship and mentoring programs were strengthened to promote greater diversity among practitioners in the field of law. At the same time, the Desafio de Acesso à Justiça (in English, Access to Justice Challenge) – run by IMF in collaboration with management consultancy ponteAponte – awarded prizes to four initiatives that promote greater access to justice in Brazil. 2020 saw the conclusion of IMF's Artigo Quinto (in English, Fifth Article) project, along with the planning of the Equidade (in English, Equity) project together with the non-profit civil society organization Politize!. These projects use new methodologies to stimulate and spread legal awareness throughout Brazilian society.

IMF also commenced work on supporting civil society initiatives aimed at fostering diversity and citizenship, backing three new projects: a research project on the

importance of women's participation in Brazilian politics for the preservation and effectiveness of democracy, carried out by the Fundação Getulio Vargas School of Law, São Paulo; a report compiling scientific findings on behavioral economics applied to diversity and inclusion, undertaken by the consultancy CLOO – Behavioral Insights; and finally, a project offering content about citizenship and access to justice by Politize!, who will distribute the material to high school students from public schools across Brazil.

We are highly proud of the results we have achieved in an atypical year and remain as motivated as ever to promote legal awareness and access to justice, fostering a freer, more diverse, and democratic society. We want to extend our thanks to all associates who have collaborated with this work – without you, such a positive social impact would not be possible. We, therefore, hope that by reading this report, you will be encouraged to continue with us on this journey, which is only just beginning.

Let's celebrate 2020's victories and move on to 2021 together!

PILLARS OF ACTION AND ACTIVITIES

1. PROMOTION OF ACCESS TO JUSTICE

2nd Desafio de Acesso à Justiça

After the success of the first edition in 2019, IMF once again held the **2nd Desafio de Acesso à Justiça**, which aims to recognize and reward projects that work with improving access to justice in Brazil while encouraging connections between people and organizations seeking to protect the rights of Brazil's most vulnerable population groups. The initiative was conducted together with the consultancy ponteAponte, which assisted with the elaboration of terms and conditions, promotion, and analysis of applications.

The onset of the Covid-19 pandemic in early 2020 led to both the IMF and candidates requiring more time to adapt to the new realities of quarantine, social distancing, and remote working, and thus the launch of the 2020 Desafio de Acesso à Justiça was strategically pushed back as a result. Instead, the initiative commenced in the middle of the

year with registration opening for civil society organizations, individuals, collectives, social movements, intersectoral alliances, networks, academic groups, and educational institutions.


We were also aware that the pandemic might leave the projects' target audiences increasingly vulnerable, thus putting their fundamental rights at further risk. After considering the difficulties involved in promoting access to justice during the pandemic, the initiative organizers decided to factor in a related criterion when evaluating the projects.

The 2nd Desafio de Acesso à Justiça was announced via e-mail, Facebook, LinkedIn, and the IMF's Instagram. The initiative also counted on the collaboration and assistance for promotion purposes of the following organizations: Conectas Direitos Humanos, Fundo Brasil de Direitos Humanos, Grupo de Institutos Fundações e Empresas (GIFE), Instituto Pro Bono and Rede de Filantropia para Justiça Social.

By the end of the first round, 124 separate initiatives across almost every state in Brazil applied (106 were eligible). Given the pandemic context, the number of participants remained

significant compared to the previous year's event, indicating the **IMF's increasing relevance in this area.**

The number of registrations from the country's Northern region was impressive, being the region with the second-highest number of projects.



The 2nd Desafio de Acesso à Justiça also relied on the participation of ten **IMF members** (Mattos Filho partners) in the **first round of project evaluation**, who were trained on how to apply the candidate analysis methodology by ponteAponte. Two ponteAponte professionals also evaluated each initiative, resulting in submissions being triple-checked. After the average scores for each project were considered, 20 initiatives were selected for the second round.

All the selected initiatives sent their documents on time, and, unlike the previous year, there were no withdrawals at this stage.

The third and final round of the initiative saw a jury's evaluation, **composed of eleven leading specialists across the fields of law, citizenship, the promotion of democracy and human rights, and access to justice.**

The winners of the 2nd Desafio de Acesso à Justiça were announced virtually on December 10, 2020, together with a presentation of the projects by their coordinators. Prizemoney for the initiative increased as well, being BRL 140,000 for the winners. However, **the final distribution of the prizemoney reached BRL 160,000 – 15% more than expected.**



This project promotes access to justice by presenting a theatrical play in public spaces, which addresses issues of law, gender, race, class, and the fight to stop violence against women in the northeastern state of Piauí. The project is carried out in collaboration with the Brazilian Bar Association's (OAB) Commission for Supporting the Victim of Violence and the Commission for Truth on Slavery.

BONUS! A PROJECT RECOGNIZED IN RIO GRANDE DO SUL

Through registration to the 2nd Desafio de Acesso à Justiça, we became aware of the University of Santa Cruz do Sul's scholarship program. Observing its relevance to the country's southern region and linking it to our objective of diversifying legal professionals' profile (see section 2 of this report) – IMF decided to grant a BRL 36,000 scholarship covering half-tuition costs to a master's student at the university. The student will carry out a study titled "The crisis of jurisdiction and the culture of peace: mediation as a democratic, autonomous and consensual means for conflict resolution."

2. AWARDING SCHOLARSHIPS



Ever since the IMF was established, we have run a scholarship program, ultimately seeking to promote professionals' diversification in the legal market. In this scenario, we aim to boost students interested in working with issues of citizenship, access to justice, and human rights.

As part of the program's objectives, we intend to reduce the inequality in accessing quality higher education that is prevalent in Brazil, mainly in fields with an elitist tradition, such as in law. Thus, our focus has been to benefit economically disadvantaged students who demonstrate exemplary academic performance and high academic potential.

MODELS OF COOPERATION


We promote two models for granting scholarships. In the first, scholarships are offered in coordination with other educational institutions and social projects, while in the second model, the scholarship is paid directly to the law student (whether an undergraduate, master's, or doctoral student). Among our collaborations with other institutions, we have:

- **15 scholarships** offered in collaboration with **Instituto Semear**, supporting law students with monthly financial assistance;
- **2 scholarships** with the **Associação Endowment Direito Getulio Vargas**, benefitting students in situations of social and/or economic vulnerability who show great potential to take part in student exchange programs and psychological assistance;
- **5 scholarships** offered to members of the **Brazilian Society of Public Law (SBDP)** for studying public law;
- **1 scholarship** awarded in collaboration with **Instituto Sol**, providing monthly financial assistance to a student at Presbiteriana Mackenzie University in São Paulo.

Meanwhile, there are two ways that scholarships are paid directly to students: a monthly scholarship, in which IMF bears the full monthly tuition fees of the law course at the university; and a pre-determined cost-of-living assistance grant to assist with students' living costs, so that they may remain able to continue their studies.

We currently have eight scholarship recipients under this model:

- **3 students** from the **PUC-RJ Law School**, with cost-of-living assistance grants;
- **2 Mackenzie-SP** Law students, with monthly tuition scholarships;
- **1 Ph.D.** student in Law at **PUC-RJ**, with cost-of-living assistance grants.



In addition to the scholarships themselves, law students supported by the IMF have access to the Mattos Filho library, where they are encouraged to seek bibliographic references and attend some specific training courses available at the firm's corporate academy.

MENTORING PROGRAM

Seeking to develop students' skills further, the scholarships are accompanied by a mentoring program led by IMF associates, Matos Filho's senior lawyers, and other partners. A complete list of those who participated in the program in 2020 is included below.

Scholarship recipients supported in 2019 continue to receive mentoring from the program. Therefore, a total of 43 pairs of students and partners are currently participating.

“In 2019, I was mentored via IMF's program by Renata Correia Cubas. Having this experience with her was one of the most important things of my year because, at my age, it is almost unimaginable to have someone with the competence and the dedication available to support me and help me think about the future of my career.

Renata showed me that I am much more powerful than I think and that achieving my career goals depends more on my courage than on my fears. Thanks to the strength and support she gave me, I applied for a job position at Mattos Filho last year. I had previously imagined that taking such a step was beyond me and that I would not fit. Today, I am a young talent [intern] at the firm, working in the Corporate Criminal Law practice area. Almost a year after that first step, I feel very happy and fulfilled by the work I have been carrying out and the friendships and other support networks I have gained.

MEETINGS AND PARTICIPATION IN OTHER PROJECTS

We invite our scholarship recipients to participate in virtual training on relevant topics to law students and foster closer relationships between students to help them build a support and connection network.

To promote increased integration at Mattos Filho, we also invite our scholarship recipients to participate in Mattos Filho-organized events regarding diversity, inclusion, and human rights, and this is combined with webinars conducted as part of the Artigo Quinto project, carried out by both Politize! and the IMF (see section 3 of this report). Some undergraduate scholarship recipients even took part in the recording of the videos for this project.

The IMF scholarship program makes it possible for me to fully dedicate myself to my studies and participate in a series of extracurricular activities.

The mentoring program is also absolutely incredible. During our mentoring sessions, I can speak freely about more personal issues related to my performance in the field of law – which I only began to properly understand at university, as well as more specific questions about the profession itself. I can then use this to better direct my studies towards my intended career path.

3. DISSEMINATING LEGAL KNOWLEDGE

ARTIGO QUINTO

Developed in collaboration with Politize!, a civil society organization that seeks to form a new generation of citizens aware of and committed to democracy, the Artigo Quinto project aims to spread knowledge about fundamental rights and responsibilities guaranteed in Article 5 of the Brazilian Federal Constitution.

Mattos Filho's professionals, who are considered the best lawyers in Brazil, prepare the content, then it is sent to Politize!, which adapts it to make it more accessible to the public, transforming it into blog posts, podcast episodes, and videos. The video series is led by the same Mattos Filho professionals who wrote the original content.

Altogether, we count on the active participation of 70 professionals from the law firm as well as six IMF scholarship recipients (see section 2 of this report) for the recording of videos.

“For me, participating in the Article Fifth project is a culmination of the ideals that made me choose to go to law school.”



At university, we are taught about civic rights and responsibilities, yet sometimes we are unaware that not every citizen has access to that information. One of our missions as legal operators is to ensure that our knowledge is not trapped exclusively in the legal world, and in this way, we can contribute to democracy and society's evolution. Daily, we forget that before being a door to the labor market, the law is the foundation of a democratic state and should, therefore, be accessible to all. Artigo Quinto reminds us of this and gives us the opportunity to reframe our role.

RESULTS

In December 2020, the project concluded with the publication of Article 5's head provision, 78 items, and four paragraphs in new and more accessible wording. Altogether, the project's website **was accessed more than 1.8 million times**.*

Over the two-year duration of the project, our audience consisted of 60% women in the 18-25 age group - mainly from the states of São Paulo, Rio de Janeiro, Minas Gerais, and Bahia.

Artigo Quinto is innovative and confronts the unacceptable reality that legal language is a huge barrier for a large part of the population, who, by not clearly understanding their own rights, are deprived of exercising them properly, becoming vulnerable. I see the project as a tool to overcome this reality through knowledge, which allows citizens to fully exercise their rights, especially regarding access to justice. That is why participating in Artigo Quinto proved to be an incredible opportunity – both for recognizing privileges and contributing to overcoming vulnerabilities.

WEBINARS

As an extension of the Artigo Quinto project, the IMF promoted a series of webinars in 2020 to clarify the fundamental rights provided in Article 5 of the Brazilian Federal Constitution.

Four meetings were mediated by directors and an IMF's associate, with lawyers who authored the project's content. Taking the whole series into account, we were able to reach an audience of over 120 people.



EQUIDADE

Still in 2020, and given the conclusion of Artigo Quinto in December, IMF, and Politize! started planning for the Equidade project. Following up on the work carried out during Artigo Quinto, the proposal is to present human rights from a Brazilian and international perspective, bringing its historical evolution, its current state of affairs, and the challenges it faces in remaining effective – of course, all presented in accessible language.

With the launch scheduled for January 2021, we already have material produced by Mattos Filho's associates on the first two topics: international systems to protect human rights and women's rights. As with the Artigo Quinto project, this production will also be transformed into videos and podcasts.

4. SUPPORTING CIVIL SOCIETY INITIATIVES RELATED TO DIVERSITY AND CITIZENSHIP

“WOMEN IN POLITICS”, WITH FUNDAÇÃO GETULIO VARGAS SCHOOL OF LAW IN SÃO PAULO (FGV DIREITO SP)

Bearing in mind that 2020 was an election year and that the underrepresentation of women in the Brazilian Legislative branch is still an issue, IMF supported the production and publication of the research “Women in Politics,” carried out by the Fundação Getulio Vargas School of Law - SP.


For the IMF, this collaboration with FGV Direito - SP in 2020 represented the possibility of promoting a discussion about a more democratic and representative country, as the publication deals with gender equality from a political perspective.

BEHAVIORAL ECONOMICS APPLIED TO DIVERSITY AND INCLUSION, WITH CLOO – BEHAVIORAL INSIGHTS UNIT

The IMF also collaborated with behavioral economics consultancy CLOO – Behavioral Insights Unit to produce a book about behavioral insights applied to diversity and inclusion. The purpose of the material is to encourage organizations and corporations to promote diversity and inclusion policies within their business strategies.

Despite the pandemic affecting both Brazilian and European scientists’ work, we still managed to carry out studies and all the critical readings necessary to produce the publication.




ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP SCHOOL WITH POLITIZE!


This initiative created pedagogical and training material for teaching via distance learning and training for students in order to improve the quality of public education offered in Brazil.


